**Interesting fact:**

Daylight Saving Time. The idea of aligning waking hours was first proposed way back in 1784 by Benjamin Franklin to conserve candles. Benjamin Franklin suggested waking up earlier in the summer would economize candle usage and be a considerable savings. While Franklin was a delegate to France, he encouraged the French to abandon their usual custom of waking up at noon, instead waking up with the sun. Benjamin Franklin published a proverb, “early to bed and early to rise makes a man healthy, wealthy and wise.” Fast forward to World War I, at a time to conserve fuel, the Germans and Austrians began Daylight Saving on April 30, 1916, followed by Belgium, Denmark, France, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Sweden, Turkey, Tasmania, with 3 weeks later Nova Scotia, Manitoba and Britain. In 1917, Australia and Newfoundland. In the United States Daylight Savings was not formally adopted until March 31, 1918. It was repealed in 1919. During World War II, President Franklin Roosevelt reinstated Daylight Saving with states free to choose whether or not to observe Daylight saving Time and with no uniform start or ending date. On January 4, 1974, President Nixon signed into law the Emergency Daylight Saving Time Energy Conservation Act of 1973. Beginning January 6, 1974, Daylight Saving Time Energy Act, clocks were set ahead October 5, 1974. Congress amended the Act, and Standard Time returned on October 27, 1974. Daylight Saving Time resumed on February 23, 1975, and ended on October 25, 1975. Legislation enacted in 1986, Daylight Saving Time in the U.S. began at 2:00 a.m., on the first Sunday of April and ended at 2:00 a.m., on the last Sunday of October. The Energy Policy Act of 2005, extended Daylight Saving Time in the U.S. Beginning in 2007, though Congress retained the right to revert to the 1986 law should the change prove unpopular or if energy savings are not significant. Going from 2007 forward, Daylight Saving Time in the United States begins at 2:00 a.m., on the second Sunday of March and ends at 2:00 a.m., on the first Sunday of November. Western Europe, including the countries that are members of the European Union, Daylight Saving Time begins at 1:00 a.m., Greenwich Mean Time or (GMT). This is the time displayed by the Shepherd Gate Clock at the Royal Observatory in Greenwich, London. Daylight saving time 2022, in California (Pacific Time) began at 2:00 a.m., on Sunday, March 13 and ends at 2:00 a.m., on Sunday, November 6.
