I know that God heard me, as this old Church, was the Sanctuary and Memorial place, for Frontiersmen, to Cowboys, Renegade Indians, Spanish and Mexican Soldiers, and finally American Soldiers and Marines. Joined by 1st Marine Division Association Board Member, Ernest Cornwell and his beautiful bride, it was an evening filled with “Historical Story” and an emotional setting, for “Colors.” Only the General rates a Military Aide, but Lori, General Woolworth’s Aide, joined me temporarily as my Aide, which was awesome and was always on my bucket list. Just a wonderful gathering of Active
